About the Association:

Founded in 1988, the *Latino Judges Association, Inc.*, (formerly known as the Association of Judges of Hispanic Heritage) was developed by a group of Latino Judges determined to increase and to promote diversity on the bench. The purpose of the Association includes: to serve as a forum to discuss areas of mutual concern among Latino Judges; to encourage judicial service among Latinos; to publicize and recognize achievements of Latino Judges and others; and to educate the public about the judicial system and the role of the Latino Judges.

About the Internship Program:

The 2017 Summer Internship Program of the Latino Judges Association will run from June 4, 2018 through August 10, 2018 and will provide one law student with a variety of experience. The intern will be under the supervision of a Judge or Justice assigned to the New York City, New York State or Federal Court. The intern will rotate among the courts (Court of Appeals, Appellate Division, Supreme Court, Family Court, Criminal Court, Civil Court, Housing Court, Federal Court and/or Town Court) on a weekly to bi-weekly basis.

Interns are expected to wear appropriate business attire, to be punctual and to conduct himself/herself in a professional manner. Use of cell phones inside the courtrooms is prohibited. Intern assignments can include, but are not limited to, legal research and writing, observation of trial/hearings, and review/summary of documents. A stipend of \$2,500.00 will be provided.
